We'd like to take a moment to thank two of Creede's oldest service organizations, the Ladies Aid Society and the Elks Lodge #506. Both were founded in 1899 and are celebrating their 125th anniversaries.

The Ladies Aid Society has long provided assistance to community members in times of need in the form of meals, caregiving, and financial donations for necessities like firewood. The purchase of a pair of eyeglasses for a young Creede boy is their first recorded deed of service. Today, the LAS is best known for their huge rummage sale held every July, which allows them to continue their generous support of Creede and its residents.

The Elks Lodge #506 serves an essential role in hosting community events like holiday meals, school plays, weddings, scout meetings, and traditional concerts and dances like July 4th and New Year's Eve. The Elks are involved in countless hours of volunteering and financial aid supporting local families and other nonprofits, and provides scholarships to Creede High School graduates.

While silver mines put Creede on the map, it is to the credit of these early philanthropists who offered aid and assistance to the miners and their families. We are so grateful for the work they continue to do today.

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



#### Itineraries to Explore

Known for its mining history, the area surrounding Creede is one of many mysteries and small surprises, sure to catch the attention of anyone wishing to experience something all their own.

#### Hike the 'Up and Over'

The most well-known hike in the area can be hiked in either direction. The trailhead is across La Garita Street from Downstream Gas & Mercantile (where you can pick up drinks and snacks for your hike!). Three quarters of a mile later and 800 feet up, you'll reach the pinnacles that tower above Main Street. Find a rock and take a break while you look down on town and the valleys of the Creede Caldera. If you're hiking with younger kids, head back the way you came. Otherwise descend the "over" side, through pine trees and along the mountainside - there are a few steep drop-offs that require attentive hiking. Keep right at two forks to come down into East Willow and North Creede. From there, stroll less than a mile downhill back to town.

#### **Hike Inspiration Point**

In the summer – an early morning start is essential if you want to enjoy this hike. This trail offers beautiful views of town and amazing vistas of the Rio Grande valley. Make sure to acclimate to the altitude before setting off on this hike! Grab a water bottle and a pastry to go from the Bristol Head Bakery, and head out. It can be strenuous hike, but well worth it!



#### A Day for Live Theatre

Enjoy a delicious sandwich from Big Doug's BBQ for lunch. Then head over to the Creede Repertory Theatre for a matinee! Our nationally-acclaimed theatre is one-of-a-kind and holds a special place in the history of our town. With a fantastic repertory line-up of 7+ shows this season, you are sure to find something compelling!

#### Night Life In Creede

Start with a fantastic meal at the historic Creede Hotel on Main Street. Following dinner, you might catch a live performance of Creede Repertory Theatre's late-night comedy improv show – Boomtown! Then go around the corner to the Tommyknocker for varied live music offerings and late night hops and spirits.



#### **Into the Back Country**

Pool Table Road? Stoney Pass? Bristol Head Mountain? Or any other of our hundreds of back country roads? Venture out in your 4x4 or ATV! Wildlife, wildflowers, and stunning vistas will greet you around every corner! Rental options include Cottonwood Cove for jeeps; Creede ATV at the Snowshoe Lodge, or Creede Adventure Rentals at the RV Park offer ATVs and/or OHVs. Looking for a guided adventure? Check out Mountain Skillz! Have a blast in the back country!

#### Stargazing in Creede

The best place for stargazing in Mineral County is to just look up! High elevation, low humidity and lack of light pollution create the perfect conditions for viewing the Milky Way, witnessing a meteor shower, or night-hiking by the light of the full moon. Grab

dinner to go from MJ's Cafe, and take a gorgeous drive up **Pool Table Road** toward Hansen's Mill: from Creede, travel 7.3 miles east out of town on HWY 149 towards South Fork. Turn left onto Pool Table Road/FR600. Find the perfect spot to spend the evening gazing at the Milky Way: exceptionally bright in our dark skies.

The **Bachelor Loop Historic Tour** is the 17-mile drive through a historic mining district above Creede. Several stopping points present sparkly lights in the valley below, mirrored by the stars above.

For a completely dark experience, **Love Lake** is a small, majestic lake surrounded by mountain scenery. From Creede, travel 7 miles west on Hwy 149 towards Lake City. Turn left and travel southwest on Forest Road 523 for 10 miles and you will come right to the Love Lake parking lot. Enjoy some of the biggest views of our glorious night sky.



#### **Horseback Riding**

Trails galore interlace the stunning San Juan Mountains around Creede and throughout Mineral County. What better way to spend a day than viewing it all from the back of a horse? The following offer guided horseback rides: Freemon's Guest Ranch, Frazier Outfitters, and Cottonwood Cove. After a day of riding, head back to town and relax on the patio at Kip's Grill with a delicious burger or baja tacos and live music!

#### **Fall Color Drives**

Our golden hues of fall are most pleasing to the eye! #### **Rafting**

We have guided and rental options for rafting on the Rio Grande! For guided trips, check out Mountain Man Rafting (their shop is located in South Fork, but they offer trips starting in Creede). Be sure to wear a life jacket - that water can be COLD! After a full day of rafting, grab a pizza at the Old Miner's Inn on Main Street!



#### A Day of Water Falls

Check out the most photographed waterfall in Colorado! North Clear Creek Falls is stunning, and accessible to all just off of Hwy 149; but don't forget about its smaller sibling, South Clear Creek Falls, just a couple miles away. Park in the back of the Silver Thread Campground and find a 900 ft trail lead-

ing down to the falls. Continue south on Highway 149 and visit the Studios at Bristol for beautiful artwork and handcrafted items. Next, enjoy a delicious burger and ice cream from Freemon's Guest Ranch and General Store.



#### Hit the Gym!

Looking to get some exercise during the occasional afternoon monsoon? Something to keep the kids busy? Creede's Parks & Rec has fantastic options at the VC Multiuse Facility: indoor climbing wall, weight room and cardio equipment, youth programs and camps, a variety of classes including spin, chair yoga, and archery. Come practice your "slice" on the pickleball court, or set your intentions for the day in a kundalini yoga class with Jo Johnson, local massage therapist, zero balancing and yoga teacher.

Wind down from your workout with a little self-care at Ooh La Spa. Pick from a full range of services including nails, facials, waxing, massages, and hair. Or shop the boutique featuring bath, body and CBD products.

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#### **Mountain Biking**

Deep Creek Trail is a fantastic trail for mountain biking. After carrying your bike across a small bridge a couple miles into the trail, you'll find yourself in a lush forest. In the late summer and early fall, take a few minutes to stop and collect wild raspberries! Be sure to pack plenty of water and snacks for your adventure. After a day of riding, have a cold one at Sunnyside Bar!


#### Hike a 14er: San Luis Peak

The prominent 14,022-foot fourteener is located approximately 10 miles north of Creede. Generally considered a challenging route, it takes an average of 7½ hours to complete. It's a popular trail for hiking and other nature trips, but you will enjoy some solitude during quieter times of day. The trail is open year-round, but best from June - September.

#### Lake City for a Day

Take a drive to Lake City along the Silver Thread National Byway. Make sure to check out Lake San Cristobal when heading in. It's the second largest body of water in Colorado. Swing by local shops for delicious treats, and take in a matinee at the Mountaineer Movie Theater. Jeep and ATV rentals







are available from Lake City Auto & Sports. Rent one for a day and head to American Basin, known for its spectacular display of Alpine wildflowers. Note, the drive is difficult but gorgeous.

#### A day at the Headwaters of the Rio

Twenty miles and 30 minutes west of Creede, turn left off of Hwy 149 onto FS Rd 520 and make the drive to the Rio Grande Reservoir, particularly beautiful in September. Hike, fish, and picnic in this gorgeous area. Before heading out, stop at Opie's for a specialty coffee and ready-to-go lunch. Finish the day with ice cream at Freemon's General Store.

Field Guides can be found in many locations around town, and at the Visitor Center.



#### **Get Married!**



#### **Play Golf**

Check out how far your drive goes at 8200 feet! The Rio Grande Club in South Fork is an award-winning, 18-hole golf course that borders the National Forest. The longest par five is a challenging 600 yards, and the course has large stands of cottonwood trees, rugged rock formations and dramatic elevation changes. Six holes on the front nine play along the Rio Grande, offering a unique shot over the river on hole number six. The back nine alpine holes play at an elevation of over 8,200 feet, through stunning rock formations, fields of wildflowers, native pine and aspen trees and wildlife habitat along Alder Creek. Incredible views welcome players to #18, along with a dramatic elevation drop onto a generous fairway. After a round, satisfy your appetite at the on-site restaurant or stop by the 149 Eatery located at Cottonwood Cove for good food and ice cream!

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


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






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#### **Drive the Historic Bachelor Loop**

This 17-mile self driving loop begins and ends in town and takes you 2000 feet above Creede. A journey into our mining past and an exploration of Creede's scenic wonders, it has something for everyone. Drive past mines that were part of the 1890's Silver Boom. Walk through the old Bachelor town site, once home to over 1500 people! Stop at Last Chance Mine and take an underground mine tour. Look for wildlife (especially moose!) at the Allen's Crossing beaver ponds (particularly stunning with fall colors!). Don't forget your camera! Hungry now? Check out The Yard back in town. Yum!

#### **Tips for Driving the Loop**

- Allow at least 1 hour for the tour.
- The road has some narrow stretches and steep grades that require caution; check road conditions during inclement weather.
- Two-wheel drive vehicles should drive the tour starting south of town, in order to descend the steepest areas.
- Most of the property along the route is private. Please respect the posted signs and do not trespass or wander beyond fences.
- · Remember, the car driving UP the hill has the right-of-way




#### Rockhounding in the San Juans

Mineral deposits made the Rocky Mountains famous! Native Americans used them; explorers were enticed by the wealth they promised; prospectors were rewarded; and industries born. Settlements exploded with the boom and faded to memory when the US adopted the gold standard and the silver market crashed. Stop by the Visitor Center for rockhounding maps and info.

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#### The Man Who Killed Jesse James

More pompous than dangerous, the coward Bob Ford banked heavily on his reputation as the killer of the notorious Jesse James, whom he shot in the back! This tall, slim, unhealthy-looking drunk landed in Creede during the 1890 boomtown year. For a time, Ford did quite well for himself, running a gambling hall and saloon, and serving as the leader of the dark underbelly of town. Then, in 1892 a stranger would appear at Ford's Saloon in North Creede. Ed O'Kelly shot and killed Ford, though his motives are somewhat unclear... Bob Ford was originally buried in Creede, but his wife eventually moved his body back to Missouri. Visit Creede's two historical sites attributed to Bob Ford: his grave site, located up above town near the cemetery, and a stone and plaque outside of Wild Beaver Mountain Man Emporium at the approximate location of his saloon (see map pg 34).



#### Creede History & Museums In a Day


Start your day at the Visitor's Center where you'll see the beautiful model of North Creede depicting life in 1892. Tom Kutzley, the creator, passed away at the age of 95 in February 2024. He devoted 23 years to the accurate recreation of a bygone era, and generously donated this labor of love to Creede for it's 125th anniversary. "I just love the fact that I can bring a 3D rendering of history to life for people. I do not want compensation for my donation... just the fact that I know it is in a place that people will enjoy it for years to come is enough for me. This is my gift to Creede." Local artist Brian Smith painted the backdrop for the model. This display provides an exciting way to share our mining history!

Walk over to Mines & Memories with its extensive collection of materials and photographs from the old


silver mines. Your next stop is the Creede Historical Museum, located in the old Railroad Depot in Basham Park. The Museum originated in the 1940's and is home to old artifacts pertaining to Creede's wild west history. Creede's Historical Library is right next door.




Your final stop is the Underground Mining Museum, built right into the mountain. It took retired miners over a year to blast out the solid rock for the museum, gift shop, Community Center and Fire Department. Local-led and self-guided tours take you through the museum, imparting the history of one of the worlds largest silver-producing Mining Districts.

#### **Visit The Oldest and Only Original**

Tomkins Hardware is considered the "first fire proof building in Creede" and is the oldest business in town, constructed in 1892. It opened as "Tomkins Brothers Bank and Tomkins Brothers Hardware". The bank portion was sold, but customers can still see the original bank teller cages in the front portion of the building. The original safe is still used and is locked with the combination dial from 131+ years ago! The Tomkins business has long since passed out of the Tomkins family, but the name has always remained the same (with the title "Lumber" added at some point in the late 1900's) and continues to supply "everything you need to build but the land!"

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





#### **Drive the Silver Thread Byway**


This scenic and historic drive is one of Colorado's hidden gems. Connecting four counties and crossing the Continental Divide twice (at Spring Creek Pass and Slumgullion), it's truly one of a kind. North Clear Creek Falls is right off the highway, and is one of the 'most photographed waterfalls in Colorado.' For good reason — it's breathtaking! Enjoy shopping and dining in towns along the way. Do not forget your camera — you will have lots of photo-ops at scenic pull-outs and interpretive sites. Be sure to pick up a guidebook at the Visitor Center.

Follow the Silver Thread as it weaves in and out of towns full of remarkable stories, pulled from a rich history, alluring outdoor adventures, and stunning scenery.

#### **Our Favorite Short Hikes**

1/2 Hour to 3-Hour Hikes

'Up and Over' - Up & Back or Up & Around (3mi); significant climb to top; Trailhead is across from gas station. See page 6 for more info

South Clear Creek Falls @ Silver Thread Campground / 899 - Down & Back (¼ mi); Well-maintained trail down to a dramatic waterfall, 23 mi from Creede

**Hobbit Trail** - Up & Back; moderate elevation gain. Trail begins at stop #6 of Bachelor Loop. Views of E Willow and old mining structures. 21/2 mi from Creede.

Deep Creek Trail / 806 - Up & Back; gradual climb up. The trail follows Deep Creek up its canyon. Views and wildflowers! Trailhead 3mi from Creede.

Miner's Creek Trail / 803 - Up & Back; slight climb for first mile. Scenery, shade and solitude. Trailhead 6mi from Creede

Shallow Creek Trail / 897 - Up & Back; relatively flat; wanders through willows along creek with footbridges. 51/2 mi from Creede.

Ivy Creek Trail / 805 - Up & Back; gradual climb; Restroom at trailhead; Shade and solitude. 16 mi from Creede.

#### **Our Favorite Day Hikes**

4 to 6-Hour Hikes

Fern Creek Trail to Little Ruby Lake / 815 - Up & Back (3.7 mi one-way). Witness forest fire regrowth en route to high mountain lakes, 17½ mi from Creede.

**Inspiration Point** / 789 - Up & Back (3.5 mi one-way) Get an early start! Beautiful views of town and amazing vistas of the Rio Grande valley. Trailhead is across from gas station. See page 8 for more info

**Seepage Creek** / 509 - Up & Back (2.5 miles one way) Pastoral setting along what was Seepage Lake. 11mi from Creede.

Spring Creek Pass to Snow Mesa / 787/813 - Up & Back (2.5 miles one way) 360-degree expansive views, including the Rio Grande Pyramid. 33mi from Creede

**Phoenix Park** / 502.1A - Up & Back (2.5 miles one way) Aspen Forest hike to a waterfall. 3½mi from Creede. See page 9 for more info

Deep Creek Trail / 806 - Up & Back or Loop onto Lime Creek Rd (arrange drop-off or pickup). Creekside, views and wildflowers! Trailhead 3mi from Creede.

**Wheeler Geologic Site via East Bellows Trail** / 790 - Full Day or Multi Day - Up & Back (about 7 mi one-way) Wilderness, beautiful views and unique geologic features. 18mi from Creede.

**San Luis Peak** / 882 to 465/813 to 465.5A - Full Day - Up & Back (11 mi round-trip to top of peak) Summit a Colorado 14er! 9mi from Creede. See pg 10 for more info

Ivy Creek Trail / 805 - Multi-Day - Up & Back (9 miles to Goose Lake). Authentic Rocky Mountain hiking experience to the remote backcountry. 16mi from Creede.

#### Squaw Creek, Continental Divide and Weminuche Trail Loops

/818 - Multi-Day - Up & Back or Loop (20-30 miles) Hiking deep within the vast expanse of Colorado's Weminuche Wilderness brings you to the Rio Grande Pyramid. 30-40mi from Creede.








- Camping is limited to 14 days in a 30 day period. Reserve spot at www.recreation.gov
- Keep our land as pristine as you found it: Dispersed campers should choose spots that are previously used sites, 200ft from water source, and that keep vehicles within 300ft of a road
- Trash the Trash pack it in, pack it out. Creede offers a paid trash drop at the gas station (\$5/bag). Bury human waste/tp 2ft deep, and 200ft from water; or pack it out!
- Pets: Scoop their poop and keep them leashed.
- Plan for cold nights, even in July! At high elevations, temperatures drop significantly once the sun goes down
- Bring plenty of water. There are only a few places to fill up: the RV Dump Station, at the Visitor Center for a donation; or at the gas station

### Winter Shopping/Dining/Lodging

### **Snowmobiling**

Trails for all categories of riders are plentiful in Mineral County. Join the Snow Country Explorers Club, go on a guided adventure with Lake City Auto & Sports, or take a workshop from the crew at Mountain Skillz. Mineral County's vast expanse of National Forest and state recreation areas support more than 85 miles of groomed trails. Trails connect Creede, Lake City, and South Fork. This area of Colorado is known to have what many consider perfect riding conditions. ALWAYS check avalanche conditions first (avalanche. state.co.us), then go have a blast in the snow!





### A Day at Wolf Creek

Something most people don't know: Wolf Creek Ski Area has the most natural snow in all of Colorado. Skiing is affordable, and the terrain varies from gentle beginner slopes to the steep and deep. Spend a day at Wolf Creek – it is only 45 minutes from Creede and the drive is gorgeous. Enjoy the Hawaiian Ono Burger while you dine at the lodge. A perfect winter day!

### **Sledding & Tubing**

Great hills can be found inside Creede city limits and throughout Mineral County. A few favorite spots include Sunnyside off the Bachelor Loop, the top of Spring Creek Pass, or around the intersection of Lime & Ivy Creeks. ### Cross-County & Backcountry Skiing & Snowshoeing

All are popular winter activities in Mineral County. The soft swoosh of skis cutting a trail across snow-covered meadows on a sunny day opens unlimited backcountry territory to enthusiasts and beginners alike. Mineral County's Upper Rio Grande Nordic Club maintains many miles of groomed trails for cross-country skiers! Make the trip into town to rent gear from San Juan Sports and get updated info on where you should head out!

### **Wildlife Viewing**

Fall and winter are exceptional times of the year to observe wildlife. Mornings and evenings offer the best chance for spotting an animal. While passing Wason Ranch, you may see a large herd of elk. Truly a captivating experience, these herds can sometimes number in the hundreds. Continuing along Hwy 149, keep an eye out along the river for a chance to see an American Bald Eagle. Once you reach Pool Table Road look for the herd of Big Horn Sheep usually grazing near the road. Be careful to watch for them!









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### **Memorial Day Weekend** May 25-27th

### **June 8th**

Burro racing is a great sport begun by some of Colorado's 19th-century miners. Those hardy characters used burros to carry mining tools and supplies through the Rocky Mountains as they prospected for gold, silver, and other valuable ores. Legend has it that two miners found gold in the same location, and raced each other back to town to be the first to stake a claim. Neither could ride their animal because of its heavy load, therefore a basic rule of burro racing was established: no riders! Creede's race abides by these rules, and starts and ends on Main Street. Mini Donkey races, music, and other festivities make cheering at the finish line an all-day affair!

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# You Should Know

### How will I be affected by the altitude?

Creede's elevation is 8,852 feet above sea level, and everyone reacts differently to the altitude. Even if you are in top physical condition, the altitude can affect your body and you can easily develop acute mountain sickness, commonly known as "altitude sickness." Check with your personal physician before traveling to any high-altitude destination, and take these steps to lessen or prevent the effects of the altitude:

- Drink at least three quarts of water a day.
- Avoid overdoing it the first few days you are at high altitude.
- Get medical attention immediately if these symptoms occur: headache, fatigue, poor coordination or shortness of breath.




